The TSL Annual Report acts as a written testament to all of those members who have volunteered and devoted countless hours of their time, talent and expertise to this vital organization. Did you know that if you replaced a volunteer with a paid employee, it would cost an organization approximately \$18 an hour to pay his/her wage in the organization. I have always felt that the value of a volunteer in an organization is priceless. The tremendous amount of experience, dedication and diligence that volunteers demonstrate on behalf of the organization makes their donation of time a priceless one indeed!

As stated in our mission statement, the primary goal of the Toledo Symphony League is to provide economic support to the Toledo Symphony Orchestra by way of the annual financial

The trends in fund-raising dictate that large events have a high cost and very little financial return based on the volunteer hours invested. We intend to work smarter and not harder.

If you would like to assist and improve the TSL, please consider becoming an active member. If you are active in the organization please know that your work and efforts are always appreciated. If you are not able to be active, because of personal and/or physical limitations, we understand and appreciate your financial commitment to our organization through mem-

bership dues, fund-raising efforts, TSO subscriptions, event attendance, endowed gifts, and planned giving through the Remembrance Fund - a legacy created for our young people with a love and passion for music.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks and appreciation to the Executive Committee and the General Board who have provided support, direction and leadership to the team.

It has been my pleasure to lead the membership and take this organization into its 55th year. We are prepared and ready to enter another memorable and fantastic year!

FINANCE

Arts Advocacy Summer Summary

NEA Funding

In June, the house Interior Appropriations Subcommittee recommended a \$15.3 million increase in funding for the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) in 2009. If approved by the full House and Senate, NEA funding would total \$160 million. However, Congress is deadlocked over how to move ahead with funding for all federal programs so spending is likely to be set at last year's level until a new Congress and President arrive in Washington in 2009.

Arts Education

The House Appropriation's Subcommittee has approved \$38.6 million for Arts Education at the U.S. Department of Education. This is the second time in the past eight years that the House has included any funding for Arts in Education programs. Funding will most likely remain at last year's level until Congress reconsiders federal funding in the new year.

Artist Visas

The ARTS Act was approved by the House last April and is under consideration by the Senate, with strong hope for passage. This bill would improve the visa process for foreign guest artists.

IRA Charitable Rollover

A one year reinstatement of the IRA Rollover charitable giving incentive was approved in the House as a part of a larger tax package. The bill has become entangled in arguments over how to pay for several tax provisions and no solution has been forthcoming at this time.

The 30th Annual Showcase of the Arts culminated on the afternoon of April 27, 2008, at the Toledo Zoo's Indoor Theater located in the Museum of Science building. More than 200 students, parents, relatives and teachers attended the Awards Recognition Program and Reception.

There were 350 entries submitted although 1,400 students actually participated in the project. All participating students received a ribbon. The submitted entries received either a rosette or a blue, red, yellow or white ribbon. The art, music and written composition entries were judged by: **Zana Sandys, Barbara Selvey, Eleanor Sonntag, Dusty Rothman and Keith McWatters.** Twelve schools and 11 teachers were involved in the project.

Seventy-two winning entries, consisting of 22 rosettes and 50 blues, were attractively displayed in the Museum of Science building for more than two weeks prior to the event. The winning students

received three zoo admission tickets and the participating teachers received one admission ticket. In addition, the students, their parents and teachers received vouchers from the Toledo Symphony to attend a future family concert as an appreciation for their participation.
